7	<p>Neighbourhood watch scheme</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> JS has resigned as representative. .
8	<p>Public Toilets</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A new door hinge has arrived and will be installed Raised the possibility of getting sponsorship for toilets. LF to put out notice and to contact those who sponsor Contact Magazine carried forward. Quotes to be obtained for cutting back overhanging branches and Peak Park to be asked if any grants available Agreed that strimming and tidying of area to be carried out and a separate contract will be quoted for at the next meeting.
9	<p>Environmental awareness</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Approval for cut back of trees near Fere Mere has been submitted to TPO. Litter. There is an ongoing issue in these busy times, but an improvement has been noted in and around the village. The dog waste bin near Blackshaw Lane seems to get full very quickly but this has been discussed with the council who confirmed it was regularly being emptied. Letter from local business on the subject of rubbish was acknowledged by PC Campsites were asked to remind campers to take home their rubbish. National trust was contacted regarding the excessive ragwort on their land and PC was informed they do not have a policy on removal of ragwort. Signage pointing to the public footpath on The Rakes has been replaced.
10	<p>Memorial benches</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The issue was discussed with other local councils who have charged people for maintenance, however there seems to be a lot of requests for benches and enquirers will be encouraged to consider other options such as tree planting or memorial plaques.
11	<p>Grant Applications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> PC suggested trying to get a grant for an additional defibrillator at the toilet area and a safety mirror at the end of Church Street. LF to follow up PC also exploring the option of a grant from Farming in Protected Landscapes Grants
12	<p>Clerk's report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parish Council to look through parish register considering need for all footpaths to be registered carried forward as an ongoing action. Ongoing. Speed awareness issues and solutions are ongoing. Long term parking of caravan on Church Street to be followed up with regards to parking long term. Take forward to next month the planting of a tree to commemorate the Queens Jubilee and follow up with the Pendragon project that presented in June.

Ongoing● The PC were informed that the current playgroup committee wish to stand down and playgroup committee members and volunteers being sought to take over.● The signage at the car park on Jack Mere needs updating as does the signage highlighting the location of the defibrillator
