Mallards are notorious for nesting in awkward places and, although I have made a few 'nesty' places around the mere, she is quite likely to be in your garden shed! Please do be careful when pottering, therefore, even if you live at some distance from the water. Be on the lookout during May for when she finally leads her brood to the water! They are likely to be crossing a village road. The **Toad Patrol** this Spring rescued 1,891 toads; 1 frog; 13 Great Crested and 5 Smooth Newts. Frog numbers seemed down this year, but I can report that the two female frogs featured in the filming successfully spawned once released back to the wild.
