Nature Notes – Early birds...

The 'false start' to Spring has encouraged many birds to start up the dawn chorus already; I have heard Mistle Thrushes and Blackbirds joining the Robin and Song Thrush, while Great and Coal Tits are to be heard around the churchyard in full flow now. The Great Tit is supposed to say 'Teacher-teacher' but often departs from this script – one was performing to a distinctly Latino beat last year. The Coal Tit has a more reliable rhythm, but is very close to the Great Tit in all but tone... If it sounds like a squeaky dog toy, that's the Coal Tit, while the Great has more of a ring to it. I have only once heard the now rare Willow Tit in our churchyard, high in the Ash Trees near the stone stile. It has a buzzing, almost scolding tone to its song. Willow Tits are fond of older decaying trees, so it will be interesting to see if the spread of Ash die-back is helping them locally. I have heard them in Lathkill Dale before now, below Over Haddon, among the damper woods that they prefer.
