### Nature Notes – Early, Purple...the well-named Orchid.

The first of the Early Purple Orchids are blooming in Fern/Fere Dale, like little miracles, forcing their way up through the soil, with that stunning reddish-purple spike. Apart from the seas of Dandelions and swashes of glistening Celandines, both with their varying shades of yellow, no Spring flower has anything like this stab of bold colour in late April/early May. I'm not sure if anyone has done a study as to why so many Spring flowers, especially the early ones, tend to be yellow, while other colours are more apparent in the Summer? When I think of purple, it is the Purple Loosestrife that comes to mind, very much a Summer flower and one of the features of our Fere Mere in June/July. This is the flower mentioned by Gertrude in Shakespeare's Hamlet, in her famous speech describing the drowning of Ophelia: 'and Long Purples, /That liberal shepherds give a grosser name, / But our cold maids do Dead-mens-fingers call them.' Here they end the list of flowers with which Ophelia has made 'fantastic garlands' in her madness; and they are waterside flowers, unlike the others in the list, beckoning her towards her tragic fate. 'Early Purples' on the other hand seem happy in the dry conditions around the edges of our meadows. They are something to behold, so take a walk to see them in the coming weeks. The path up to Ricklow Dale from Lathkill is also rich in them.
