#### Could you use some help?

Over the past 5 years the Rider Trust has been able to help residents and organisations in our villages on almost 80 occasions. #### Nature Notes

The Parish Council has bought a brand-new, totally *pest-proof bird feeder* to site in a tree by the mere (and we have been kindly given permission to use the memorial Rowan tree, by the parents of Caroline Mary Tyler – in fact they are delighted for the tree they planted to be used in this way.) If you are wondering where this super-dooper new feeder is, it is being trialled in our garden at The Byways, while some more conventional feeders are currently by the mere in order to attract wild songbirds in the first place. It can take a while for birds to start visiting a bird-feeder, in a new location, so if you have put one up in your garden, have some patience. The first birds to visit the feeders in the Rowan were the Moorhens! I have written before about how these resourceful fowl are quick to spot a new opportunity, turning up in gardens all over the village when the water freezes over; this Winter is already no exception. They and the Jackdaws are too heavy to be able to use the new feeder, however, as the clever design shuts the food away when anything heavier than a woodpecker lands on the perch (and I am watching this in action. It is indeed completely squirrel proof too!) My one criticism of the 'clever' design is that filling it with sunflower hearts, as recommended, results in them all cascading to the lawn below in a very short time; for every one taken by a bird, ten seem to fall free. This looks like being solved by mixing rubbed, dried breadcrust into the seed in around a 50/50 mix. Seems to stop the free-flow, though the few that do fall on the grass are welcomed by Doves, Blackbirds and Chaffinches, which are happy ground-feeders. Anyway, expect 'the real thing' to arrive in the Rowan at Fere Mere this side of Christmas, at least.
