Nature Notes

Next Spring, I am thinking of adding a second Birdsong Walk, from Hartington. Taking in the river Dove in Beresford Dale, it is hoped to feature Dippers singing – they have a surprisingly lovely song, high pitched and loud to top the noise of tumbling water. I have heard it, early Spring, in Lathkill and in Chee Dale. Interestingly, both the male and female sing, (in many species of songbird it is just the male). Last Spring, I heard a female Crossbill sing in Macclesfield forest – a finch-song I had not heard before and gorgeous it was too, from the top of Spruce. It was only recently I read, in *all* my bird books: 'it is only the male who sings'... Don't believe everything you read; there is nothing like field work! (The male is rosy-red; female green).
